Monterey's Winter Concert is Tuesday December 6th at 7:00 p.m. in the school gymnasium. More info to come soon!

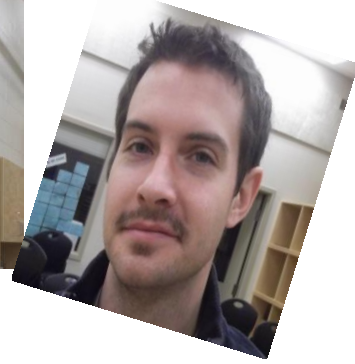


Strings Students will be performing in the District wide Holiday Strings concert at Oak Bay on December 15th at 7:00 p.m. (Again, more info to come soon!)

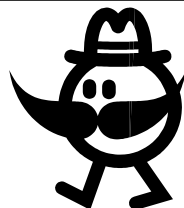
