A3. Business arising from the Minutes

Trustee Nohr requested an update on the status of the funds held back by the Ministry of Education. Secretary-Treasurer Laser advised that the Ministry holds back funding pending the actual September 30, 2012 enrollment results. The recalculated grant funding provided in December 2012 included the release of a portion of the Provincial holdback funds. The Greater Victoria School District received \$1.8 million and this funding will be included in the final budget information that will be presented in February. It is expected that additional holdback funding will be released in March 2013 but the amount is unknown at this time.

A4. Student Achievment

Rob House, Principal, Spectrum Community School introduced teacher, Tony Fogelklou, along with coach, Cayle Ratcliff, and several students from the lacrosse academy program. Tony spoke about the specifics of the lacrosse program and how well received it has been at the school. Coach Ratcliff spoke about being a former student of Spectrum and having to move to the United States to get the same opportunities that this program is now offering local students. Students, Lucas and Vishnu, both reiterated how important this academy is to students and thanked Trustees for their continued support.

Chair Orcherton thanked the staff and students from Spectrum for attending the meeting and speaking to the Board.

Trustee Ferris introduced and welcomed Mitchel du Plessi, Lansdowne Middle School, Youth and Family Counselor. Ms. du Plessi was presented with a certificate of appreciation in recognition of being the recipient of the 2012 Representative's Award for Excellence. Trustee Ferris thanked Ms. Du Plessi for the many services that she provides to the community and Lansdowne Middle School.

Ms. du Plessi accepted the certificate and thanked the Board for acknowledging her at the meeting.

Trustee Ferris reported that he attended the first Needs Budget Advisory Committee meeting for this year and was appointed the Chair of the Committee. Updates on the work of the Committee will be provided at future board meetings.

Trustee Nohr reported that being on the Community and Culture Committee has been a great experience with the sharing of information and ideas and she is pleased to advise that the ERASE program is now up and running at all school districts in the province.

Trustee McNally reported that she attended a Roots of Empathy meeting at Rockheights Middle School and Craigflower Elementary School and will be attending a social justice presentation at Rockheights Middle School.

Trustee McEvoy reported that he recently met with the Deputy Minister of Education to discuss the Cooperative Gains Mandate and the many letters received from school districts around the province. Trustee McEvoy reported that he was advised by the Deputy Minister that a response is forthcoming in answer to the questions posed by school districts. Trustee McEvoy added that he and Chair Orcherton will be attending an upcoming meeting of the Oak Bay High Replacement Project Committee.

Trustee Loring-Kuhanga reported that she attended a concert at Reynolds High School in December, Aboriginal Nations Education meetings in December and January and thanked Nella Nelson and her team for all of their efforts. Lastly, Trustee Loring-Kuhanga reported that she was involved in the Principal interviews held recently.

B. CHAIR'S REPORT

Chair Orcherton reported that two letters have been written on behalf of the Board to the Minister of Education regarding the Cooperative Gains Mandate and Provincial holdback funding. These letters are attached to this evening's meeting agenda or can be viewed on the District website.

The School District will evaluate each proposal in accordance with criteria set out in the RFP and will select the one that offers the greatest value for the benefit of the students and the community, within the approved capital funding. Construction is expected to commence on July 2, 2013.

2012/2013 AMENDED ANNUAL BUDGET BYLAW

The Minister has requested that school boards prepare and approve an Amended Annual Budget for the 2012/2013 school year. The Amended Annual Budget takes into account both the revenues and the expenditures arising from the actual September 30, 2012 enrolments, all grant amounts confirmed subsequent to the approval of the annual budget, and all amounts carried forward from the previous fiscal year. As such, the Amended Annual Budget provides a better comparison to the actual results to be reported in the financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. The 2012/2013 Amended Annual Budget reflects an enrolment decrease of 68 FTE as compared to the 2011/2012 school year.

The Amended Annual Budget has been prepared using the new Public Sector Accounting standards which requires the budget to include the operating, special purpose and capital funds. Consequently, the budget bylaw amount of \$208,580,448 includes the total budgeted expenses in the operating, special purpose and capital funds.

- Statement 2 of the amended annual budget document consolidates the revenue and expense budget amounts for all funds.
- The operating budget revenue and expenditure details are shown on Schedules 2, 2A, 2B and 2C.
- The special purpose fund revenue and expense details are shown on Schedules 3 and 3A.
- The capital fund revenue and expense details are shown on Schedule 4.

In order to pass the Amended Annual Budget Bylaw at one meeting, the Board must unanimously agree to give the bylaw all three readings at one sitting. The following motions are therefore recommended:
