Position Description Carpenter

CA - 1

Responsible to the appropriate supervisor through the assigned foreman.

CA - 2

Performs carpentry duties as assigned.

CA - 3

Maintains and repairs buildings and furnishings related to carpentry, including doors and frames, window sills and frames, door hardware, exterior wall finishes, floor finishes, millwork, partitions, interior wall finishes, baseboards and mouldings.

CA - 4

Performs new construction duties, including forming, mixing and placing concrete materials, installing vinyl tile and linoleum flooring, constructing wood or metal stud partitioning, drywall installation, insulation work, suspended ceilings, fabricating and installing millwork and furniture.

CA - 5

Maintains equipment and furnishings, including gymnasium bleachers and partition walls, fitness equipment, theatre seating, window coverings, toilet partitions and accessories.

CA - 6

Erects and disassembles scaffolding and ladders as required and works from same, including aerial lifts.

CA - 7

Repair damaged glazing, including windows, skylights, door windows and sidelights, and mirrors.

CA - 8

Measure, cut and install new glazing materials.

CA - 9

Operates and maintains hand and power tools, and carpentry shop equipment, necessary to carry out carpentry duties.

CA - 10

Reports promptly to the appropriate foreman or supervisor any mechanical failures or damage to district-owned vehicles, equipment and tools.

CA - 11

Performs duties in compliance with safety regulations.

	Training and/or experience in glazing and window replacement, door hardware, locks and security equipment.

	Must have a minimum of five (5) years carpentry experience.
