Position Description | Qualifications

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Responsible to the appropriate Manager, through the appropriate Foreman/ Supervisor, performs carpentry duties as assigned.

CA - 1

Works independently and, when required, travels from job site to job site using a School Board owned vehicle for transporting workers, supplies, materials, tools and or equipment to the job site.

CA – 2

Maintains and repairs buildings and furnishings related to carpentry, including doors and frames, window sills and frames, door hardware, exterior wall finishes, floor finishes, millwork, partitions, interior wall finishes, baseboards and moldings.

CA – 3

Performs new construction duties, including; forming, mixing and placing concrete materials, installing vinyl tile and linoleum flooring, constructing wood or metal stud partitioning, drywall installation, insulation work, suspended ceilings, fabricating and installing millwork and furniture.

CA – 4

Maintains equipment and furnishings, including; gymnasium bleachers and partition walls, fitness equipment, theatre seating, window coverings, toilet partitions and accessories.

CA – 5

Erects and disassembles scaffolding and ladders as required and works from same, including aerial lifts.

CA – 6

Repairs damaged glazing, including windows, skylights, door windows and sidelights, and mirrors.

CA – 7

Measures, cuts and installs new glazing materials.

CA - 8

Operates and maintains hand and power tools, and carpentry shop equipment necessary to carry out carpentry duties.

CA – 9

Performs other duties consistent up to the level of the assigned role.

CA - 10

Performs duties in compliance with safety regulations.

	Training and/or experience in glazing and window replacement, door hardware, locks and security equipment.

	Must have a minimum of four (4) years carpentry experience.

	School District #61 Policies and Regulations, Municipal, Provincial and Federal regulations relevant to his/her department.
