The meeting was called to order at 7:35 p.m.

A4. Student Achievment

Sarah Khosla, Vice-Principal of Colquitz Middle School, introduced teacher Ms. Heidi James and students Chris, Hunter, Mackenna, Jas and Caynan to share some of their innovative learning experiences. Students are using iPads for research, Science projects and applications such as So Crowded, Voice Threads, Sudoku, Chess, problem-solving programs and even for putting notes on the screen. The programs have a fun aspect to them which helps the students to learn. The students also displayed the programmable robots that they have built at a lunch-time Lego Mindstorm program at the school. Chair Orcherton thanked the staff and students from Colquitz Middle School for attending the meeting and speaking to the Board.

A6. Community Presentations

- a) Jim McDermott, Victor School PAC Vice-President and parent of a child attending Victor School for twelve years, stated that the parents of Victor would like to request that a motion be passed to remove Victor School from the current moratorium on Wi-Fi. He provided letters of support.
- b) Wendy Joyce, Victoria Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils (VCPAC) spoke about VCPAC, stating that each candidate for a VCPAC election must receive more than 50% of the votes cast to be successful. She referenced surveys that VCPAC has done and the volume of responses received which have indicated whether a topic is of significant interest to parents or not. She noted that VCPAC will be drafting a survey on the current Wi-Fi issue, adding that when VCPAC takes an official position on an educational issue, it must obtain 75% approval at a general meeting.
- c) Carolina Tudela, Greater Victoria Teachers' Association (GVTA) spoke against the VCPAC motions being considered by the Board at this evening's meeting. She stated that she was dismayed as she felt that some parents had not found representation with VCPAC.
- d) Peter Milne, Parent indicated that he was concerned about the two VCPAC motions on the Board meeting agenda. He felt that the first motion was not necessary as it was already entrenched in the School Act. As it relates to the second motion, he stated that he supports a trustee in a community leadership role providing support to parents.
- e) Michelle Milne, Parent expressed concern that VCPAC agendas are rarely sent in a timely manner and that many PACs do not use their PAC email addresses regularly. She expressed concern over the lack of attendance at VCPAC meetings.
- f) John Bird, President, VCPAC conveyed that it is not VCPAC's position that they are the only parent voice in the District. They actively support any PAC who wants to come to the Board and make a presentation. He invited any trustee who has a concern to attend VCPAC meetings to see things for themselves.

A7. Trustees' Reports

Trustee Ferris reported that he recently attended a meeting regarding a change taking place with the Harm Reduction Program at the Pembroke Street Health Centre. VIHA members, city councillors, community and parents were also in attendance. Another meeting is scheduled for this week and Trustee Ferris will report back next month.

Trustee McEvoy reported that he felt that everyone around the Board table would watch with concern when the Provincial budget is presented. He mentioned some of the cost pressures that the District is facing including the PST transition, teacher pension plan rate increase, and the medical services plan premium increase and that, depending on the budget that is brought down, there could be an impact on classrooms.

Trustee Horsman reported that she attended the retirement celebration for Ms. Alana Charlton, Principal at Reynolds Secondary School and acknowledged the impact that Ms. Charlton made on staff and students. Trustee Horsman added that the slogan of Reynolds is the three R's, Respect, Responsibility and Relationships and to show how much Ms. Charlton solidified that slogan, the staff gave her a silver necklace with an "R" on it.

Trustee Nohr reported that she attended Campus View Elementary School for reading week, adding that it was great to see the diversity of the students' experiences with books. Trustee Nohr also reported that she will be attending the International School Ministry Conference in April.

Trustee McNally reported that she recently attended the Macaulay and Esquimalt PAC meetings and that she is looking forward to attending "Music by the Dockyard" in Esquimalt.

B. CHAIR'S REPORT

Chair Orcherton reported that she attended Ms. Carey Nickerson's Grade 1/2 Class at Lake Hill Elementary and read to the students, adding that it was interactive and exciting to watch the students' faces alight with interest and engagement.

Chair Orcherton reported that she attended a meeting of the Culture and Community Sub Committee and that she also attended a meeting regarding the Oak Bay High replacement project. She added that the Oak Bay Request for Proposal process is now complete with three BC companies in the running.

Chair Orcherton reported that she and Wendy Joyce from the VCPAC Executive were on CFAX radio on February 12th to discuss school security with host Terry Moore and public members who called in to the show.

Chair Orcherton reported that she, along with Trustees Horsman, Alpha and Ferris, attended a Needs Budget Advisory Committee meeting on February 13th. She noted that Trustee Ferris would report out with regard to this Committee later on the agenda at tonight's meeting.

Chair Orcherton reported that Simi Sara of CKNW conducted an interview with her on February 15th with respect to Chair Orcherton's comments in the Times Colonist regarding the District's concerns expressed regarding the Provincial Holdback funds.

D. DISTRICT LEADERSHIP TEAM REPORTS

D1. Secretary-Treasurer's Report

a) 2012/2013 Amended Annual Budget Bylaw

Secretary-Treasurer Laser presented the 2012-2013 Amended Annual Budget stating that the Amended Annual Budget takes into account both the revenues and the expenditures arising from the actual September 30, 2012 enrolments, all grant amounts confirmed subsequent to the approval of the annual budget, and all amounts carried forward from the previous fiscal year. As such, the Amended Annual Budget provides a better comparison to the actual results to be reported in the financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013.

The Amended Annual Budget has been prepared using the new Public Sector Accounting standards which requires the budget to include the operating, special purpose and capital funds. Consequently, the budget bylaw amount of \$208,580,448 includes the total budgeted expenses in the operating, special purpose and capital funds.

E1. Needs Budget – Trustee Ferris

Trustee Ferris reviewed the Needs Budget document, on behalf of the Budget Advisory Committee, and advised that the Committee has taken a different approach in developing the needs budget. Each department was asked to indicate needs based on a five percent increase to their current budget. He advised that the document is not final and that Trustees can provide additional suggestions. A brief discussion ensued. Chair Orcherton clarified that the needs budget would be submitted to the Ministry alongside a balanced budget.

E2. Saanich Healthy Advisory Committee – Trustee McNally

Trustee McNally stated that she has been attending the Saanich Healthy Advisory Committee meetings although there has been no directly-related School District business thus far.

E3. Success by Six – Trustee McNally

Trustee McNally advised that she has been attending the Success by Six meetings and is looking forward to the program becoming even more vibrant in the future.

F. NEW BUSINESS/NOTICE OF MOTIONS

F1. Victoria Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils – Trustees Horsman & Orcherton

Trustee Orcherton presented the motion. Discussion ensued with comments made by some that the motion was not needed since the matter is encompassed in the School Act, while others supported the motion, praising the hard work and integrity of VCPAC. Chair Orcherton reminded Trustees that the motion is speaking to the request that was made by VCPAC representatives, seeking support and that this motion is affirmation in the face of what VCPAC considered as an attack on their integrity by a Trustee's blog posting.

That the Board of Education of School District No. 61 (Greater Victoria) affirms its full support for the Victoria Confederation of Parent Advisory Councils (VCPAC) and its voice as the representative organization in School District No. 61 for parents.
