

DISTRICT COORDINATOR

The Greater Victoria School District provides public educational services to over 20,000 students in the Greater Victoria Area, encompassing six municipalities. To provide this service, the District has a current operating budget of \$184 million and employs approximately 3,000 staff; which includes, teachers, principals and vice-principals, support staff, psychologists, speech and language pathologists and exempt managerial staff.

With the development of the School District Strategic Plan and the implementation of the new curriculum it is clear that a learning division, with a coordinated support plan, is both critical and integral to moving the learning environment of the Greater Victoria School District forward.

Three District Coordinator positions were created to be key members of the **Learning Division Team**. The current team encompasses the Director of Learning, the Principal of French Immersion, Languages and Multiculturalism, the Vice Principal of Education Technology, and the coordinator of Aboriginal Nations Education. The Learning Division Team also works closely with the Student Support Services Learning Division and the Partnership and Pathways Division.

Our three District Coordinators are responsible for Elementary, Middle and Secondary Schools throughout the district and have knowledge and exemplary experience in one or more of these areas. A portion of these three positions include district responsibilities and the coordination of mandates from the Ministry of Education. The District Coordinator positions are for a term of five years and are compensated at the Elementary Vice- Principal salary level.

Candidates must demonstrate their suitability for this position by answering the following three questions:

- 1. Given the development of the School District Strategic Plan, the implementation of the new curriculum and the current educational focuses of School District No. 61, please describe your education vision for the coordinator of learning role.
- 2. Please describe your experiences in learning leadership that have prepared you for this coordinator of learning role.
- 3. Please describe your personal and professional educational background and/or personal life experiences that have prepared you for this position.
