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that classroom pets are not desirable at all, in the development of the Policy, and that the Superintendent draft a Regulation to implement the Policy when finalized by the Board.

That the motion "That the Board of Education of School District No. 61 (Greater Victoria)) direct the Policy Sub Committee to develop Policy in regard to animals kept as "classroom pets," and that the Committee take into account the BCSPCA's statements on animals in classrooms and the possibility that classroom pets are not desirable at all, in the development of the Policy, and that the Superintendent draft a Regulation to implement the Policy when finalized by the Board" be amended to strike the word "account" and replace it with "consideration" and to strike the words "and the possibility that classroom pets are not desirable at all, in the development of the Policy."
