As you can see from the graph above, Campus View is more than twice as far away from our house as Willows, and both the Middle and High School options are significantly further as well. Beyond the consideration of convenience, the School District must also consider the safety factor of requiring a student to travel twice as far as is required to a school daily. I am formally calling this out as a concern at this point. A recent study conducted by Germany-based Education International showed that long journeys to school have a negative impact on students' health and on their education achievement levels. My recommendation/ask is that the ten (10) houses the North (even numbered) side Middowne Road be moved into the Willows/Monterrey/Oak Bay catchment. As it pertains to this particular street, it make no sense to have half in the Willows and half in Campus View.
