We Have a Problem: Limited Space

- Increasing student enrolment
- One of the fastest growing school districts in the province this year.
 - 1,000 additional students in the past 4 years
- Restored collective agreement language that restricts students with diverse learning needs has impacted the availability of space in our schools






The Challenge

- Limited capital resources available (would involve land disposition)
- Goals is to balance all the needs of:
 - 47 different schools
 - 20,000+ students
 - Thousands of parents
 - Passionate and dedicated community members
- Ensure equitable access to amenities in all of our schools


Community input through consultation




May 2019 – Phase Three Consultation Current, final phase

District has heard from the community and revised plans wherever possible

The District has been able to accommodate many of the specific neighbourhood requests it has received

Communities still have the opportunity to influence the outcome





The Challenge

Both <u>Quadra</u> and <u>Tillicum</u> Elementary Schools have reached their buildings' capacity and are projected to exceed their enrolment capacity in future years.





Quadra - Phase 2 Proposal

Proposal	Considerations	We want your input
 The Quadra Elementary Catchment would be reduced through the creation of a Cloverdale catchment boundary. 	 Quadra Elementary has reached its building capacity and the current school boundary is projected to continue to exceed its catchment capacity. Feedback from the Tillicum community reflected that the boundary proposals did not address the enrolment pressures at Tillicum. 	



Quadra - Phase 3 Proposal

Proposal	Considerations	We want your input
The Quadra catchment is to be adjusted to include the southern portion of the current Tillicum catchment.	 Tillicum's current catchment student population is 460 students Tillicum's targeted enrolment capacity is 356 students Quadra's targeted enrolment capacity is 450 students Quadra's newly proposed catchment population is 435 students in addition to including Cloverdale as part of its French Immersion catchment 	




Quadra - Phase 3 Proposal

Proposal	Considerations	We want your input
 Catchment pathway for French and Regular Program Quadra students Quadra	 Reynolds has met its school capacity and projected to exceed its capacity Vic High is able to accommodate Quadra students With the proposed Cloverdale boundary encompassing the northern half of the current Quadra boundary the travel distance from Quadra to Vic High is 3.4 km vrs 2.7 km to Reynolds. The majority of the Quadra residents live in the southern half of the catchment and will not experience an increase in travel distance to Vic High. 	









