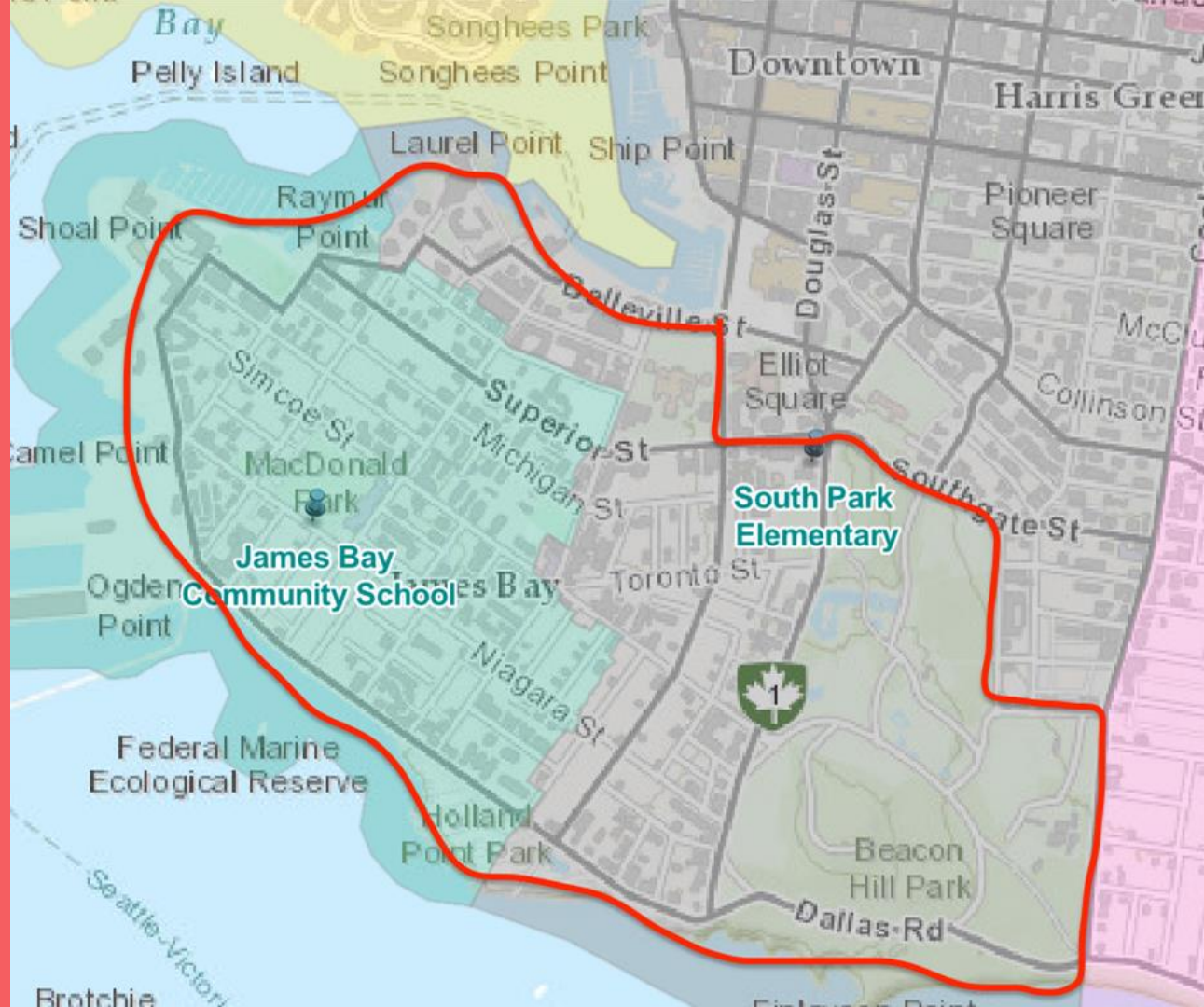

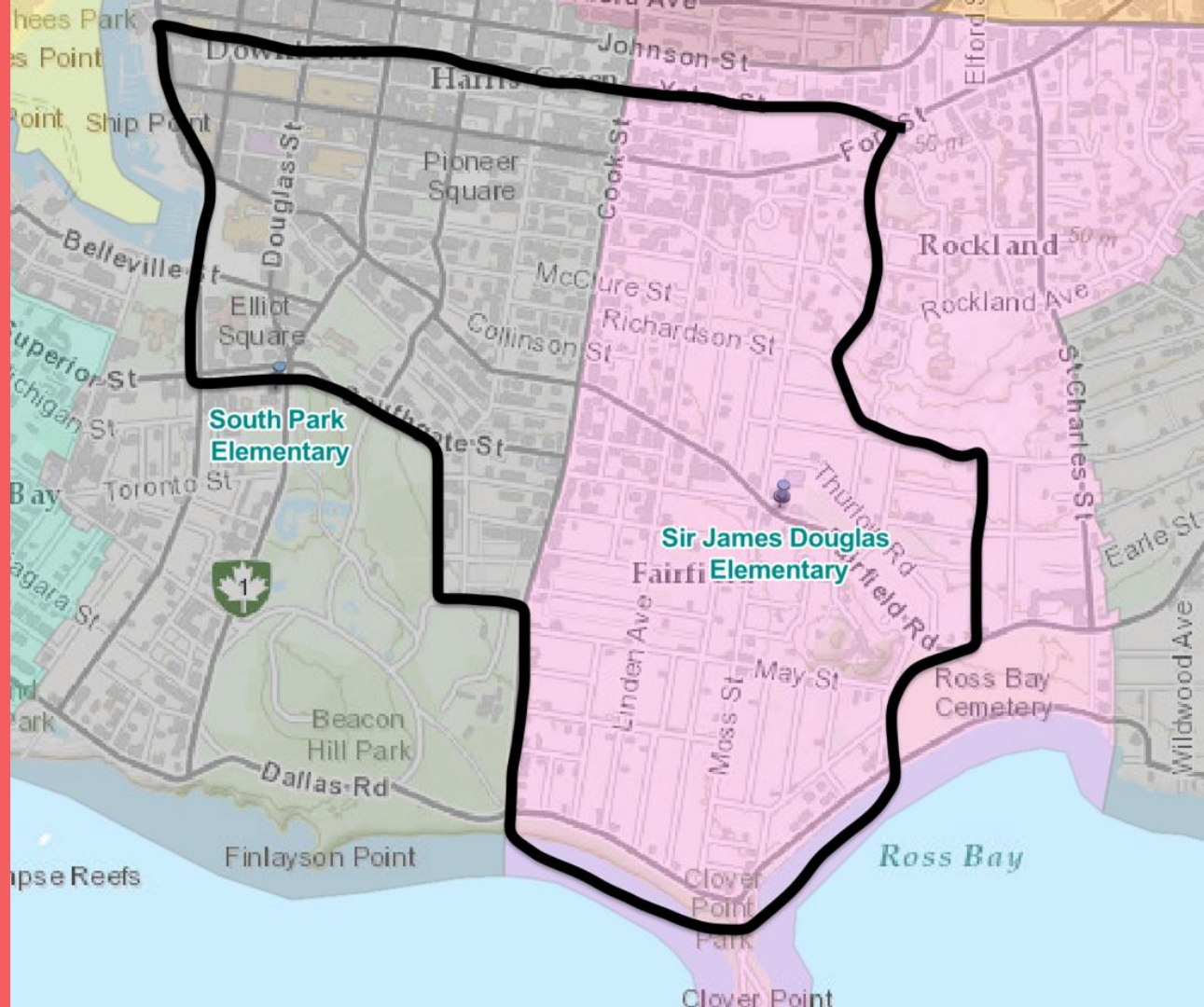
James Bay

- Increase in catchment size is managed by transfers into SPFS
- 40 students in. 40 out.
- Proposed enrolment remains = 182 (of 196)



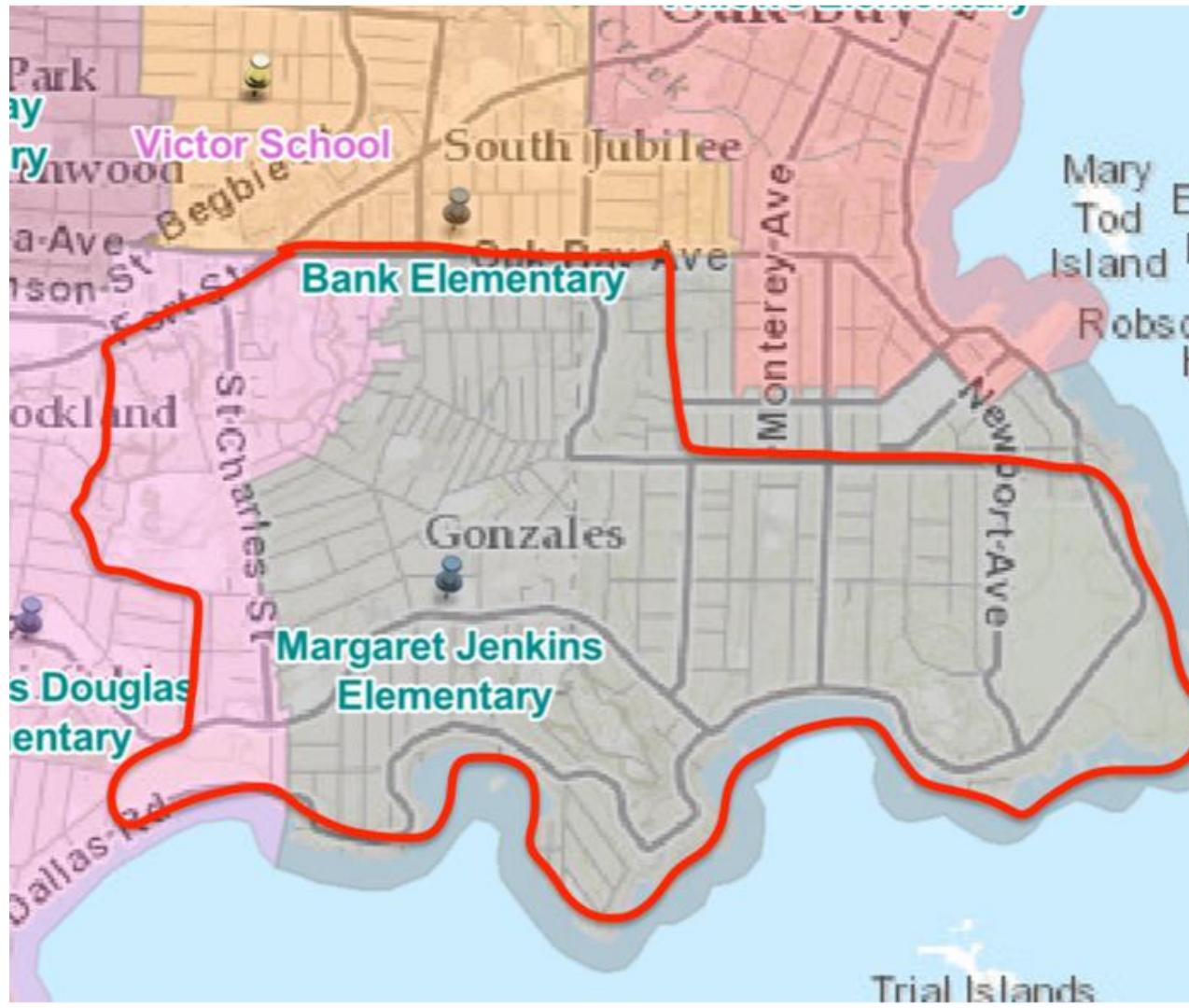
Sir James Douglas

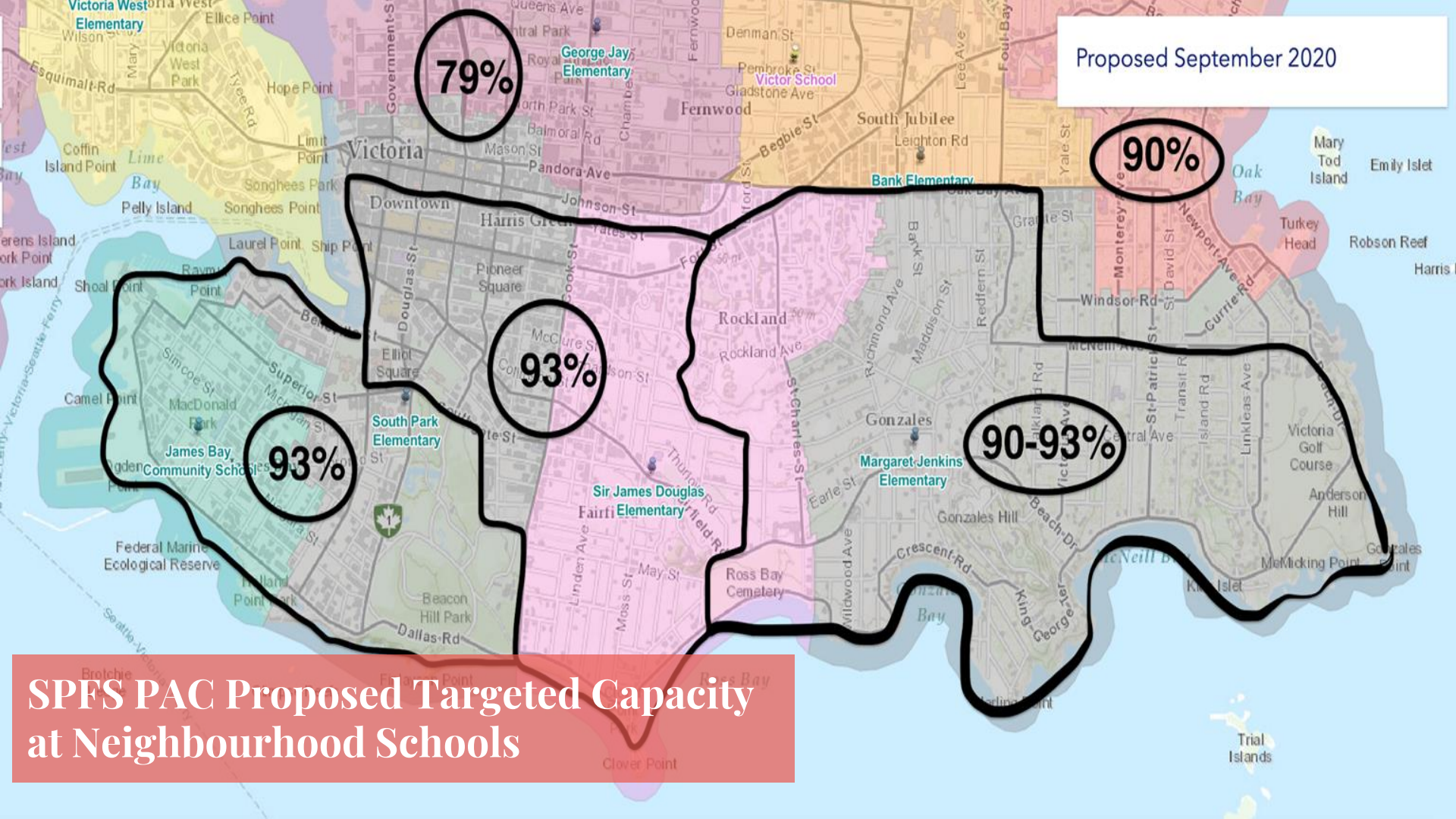
- Has adequate space
- Remains right sized by shifting students to MJ/Willows
- Alleviates GJ with SPFS support
- Projected enrolment = 426 (of 460)



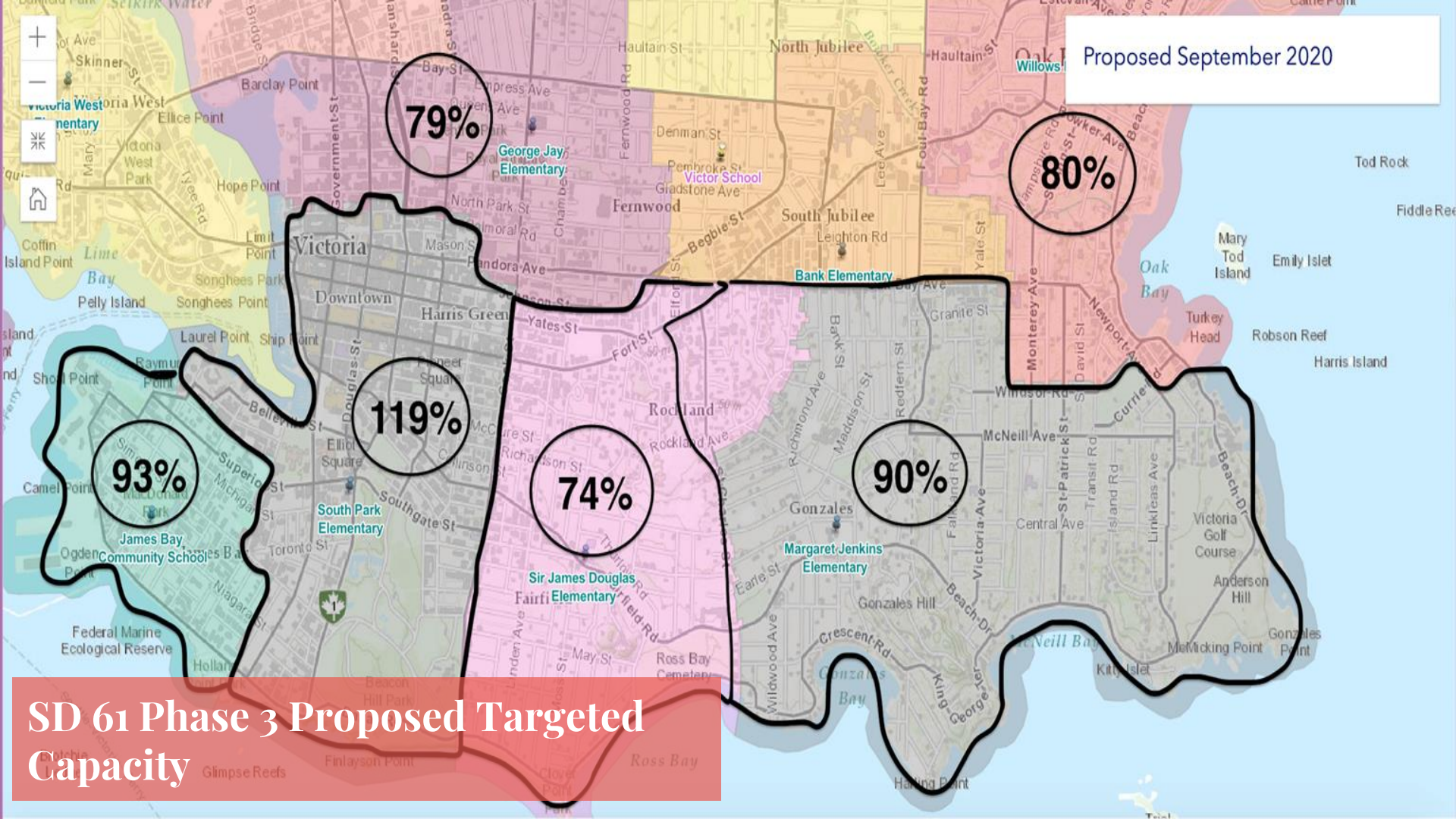
Margaret Jenkins

- Balances capacity more equitably
- Requires shifting of some students into Willows
- Vic High to Oak Bay High Family
- Projected enrolment = 448-462

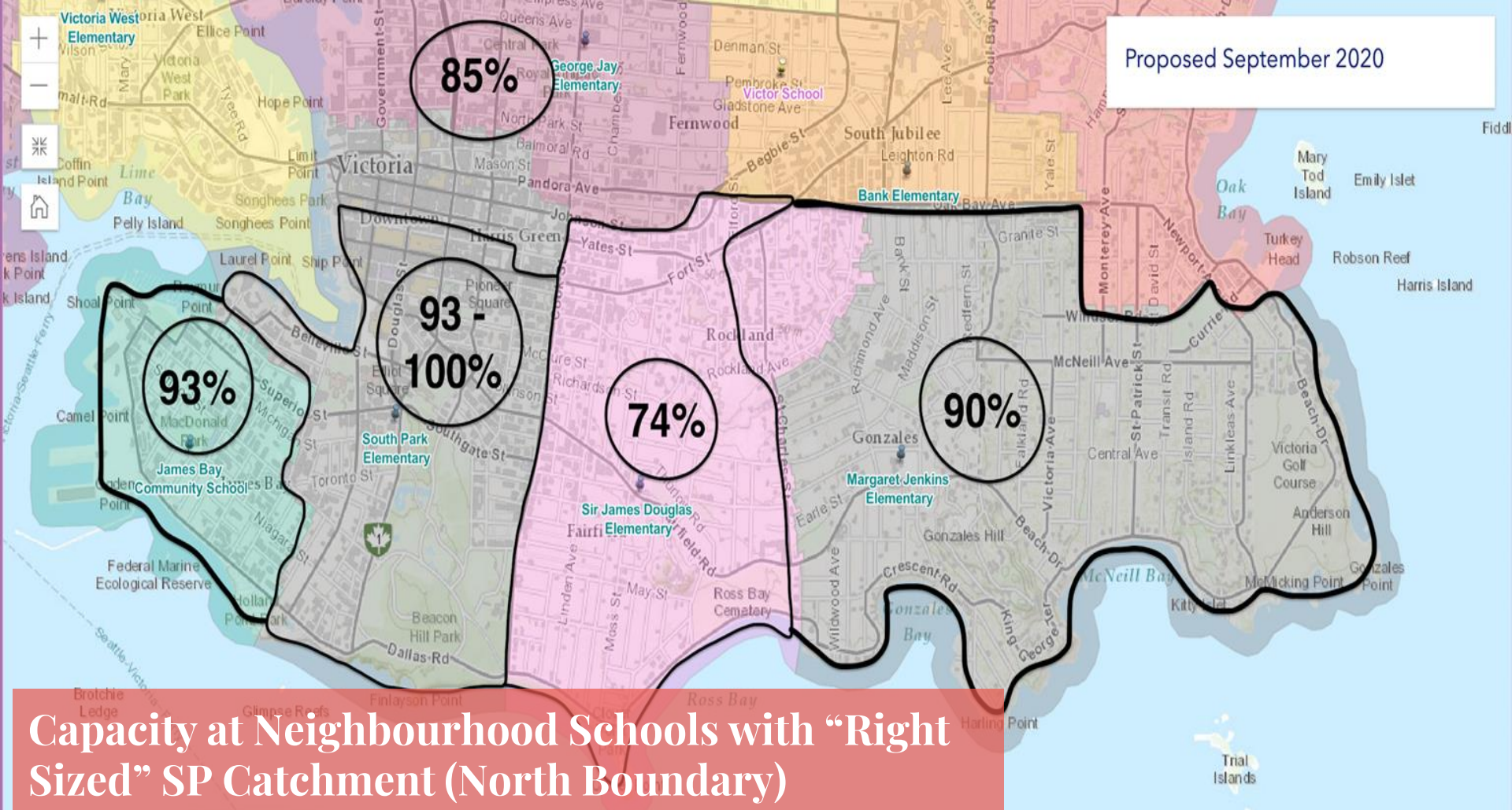


SD 61 Phase 3 Proposed Targeted Capacity

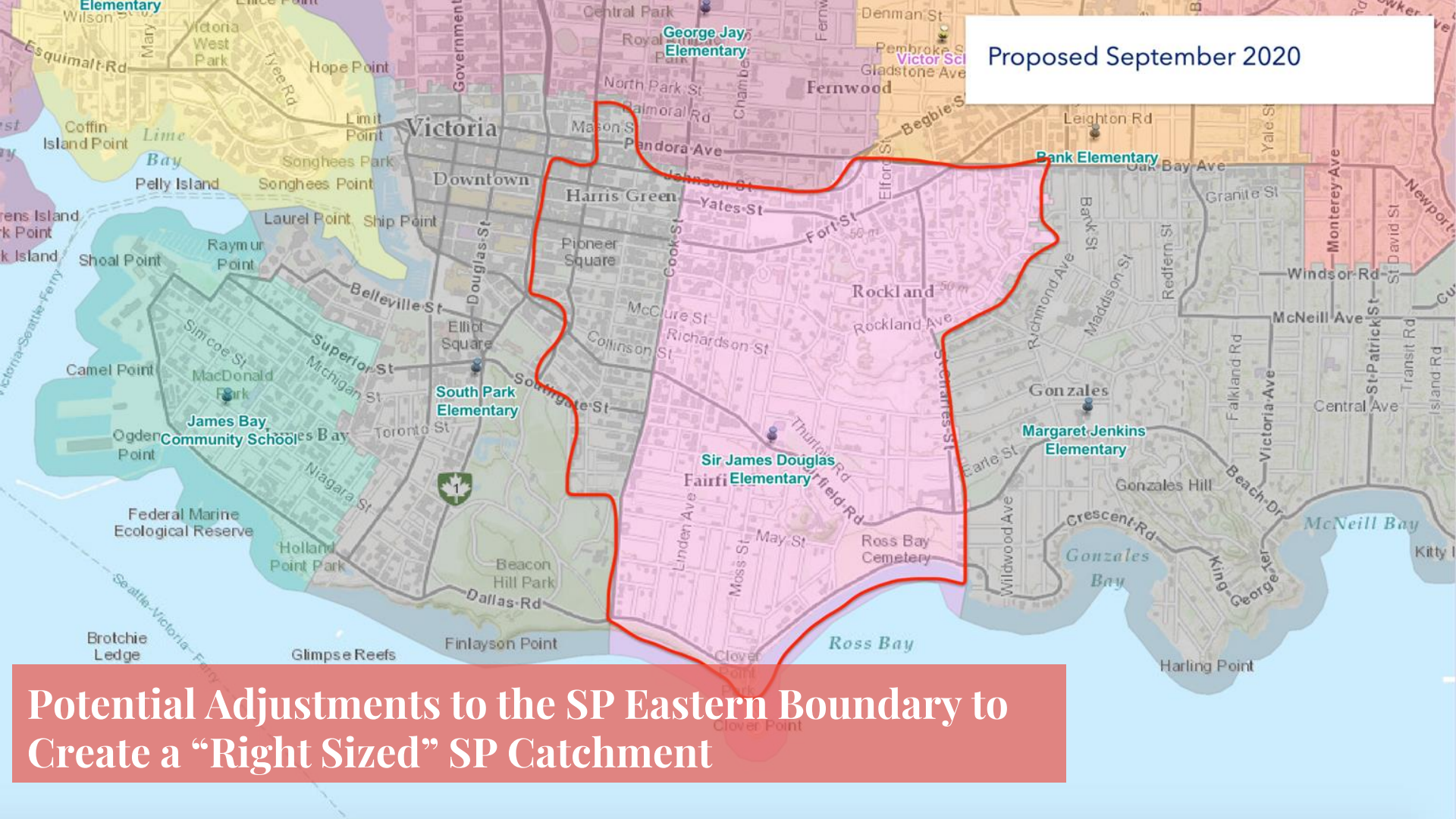

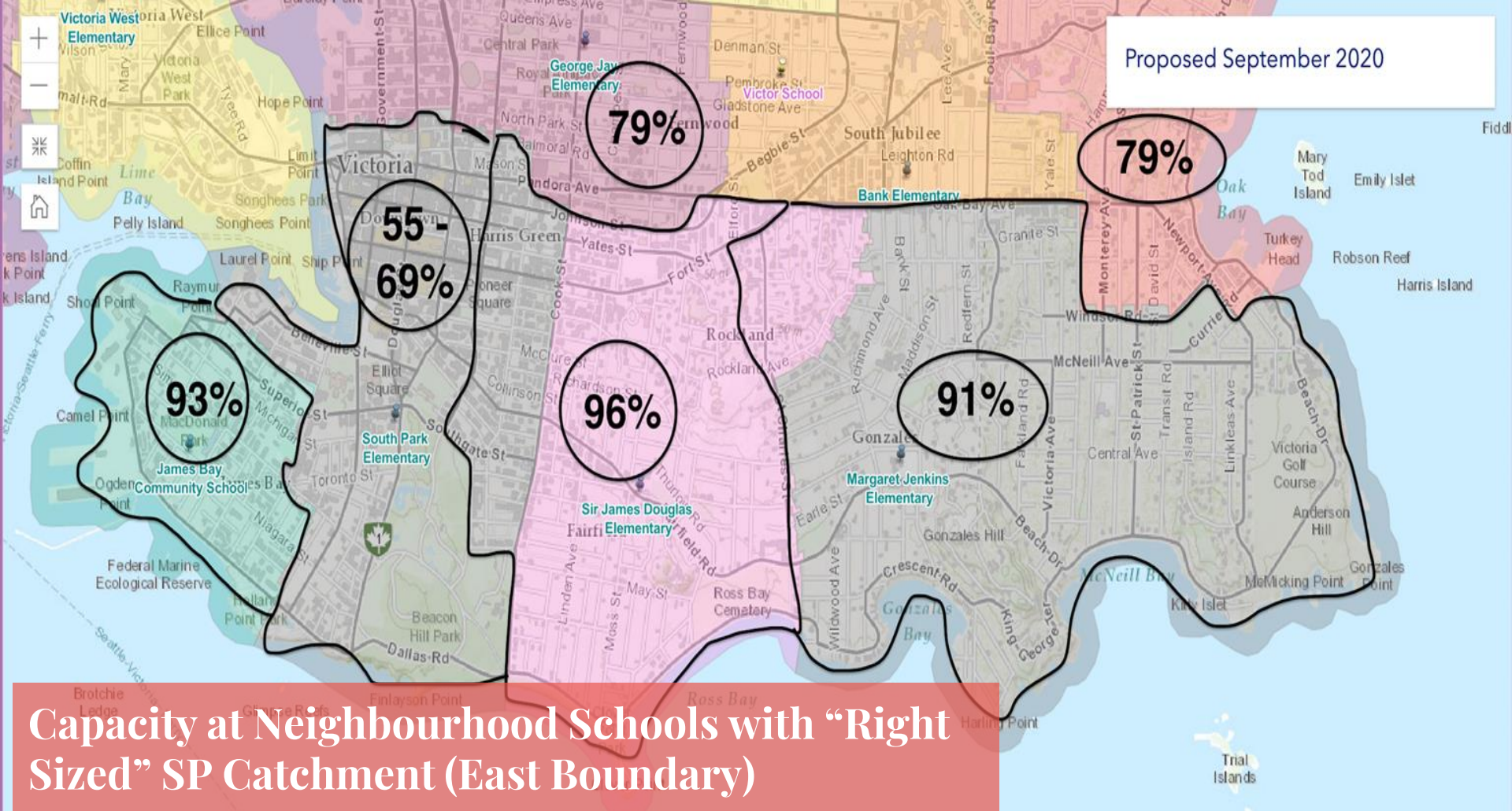

Create a “Right Sized” SP Catchment



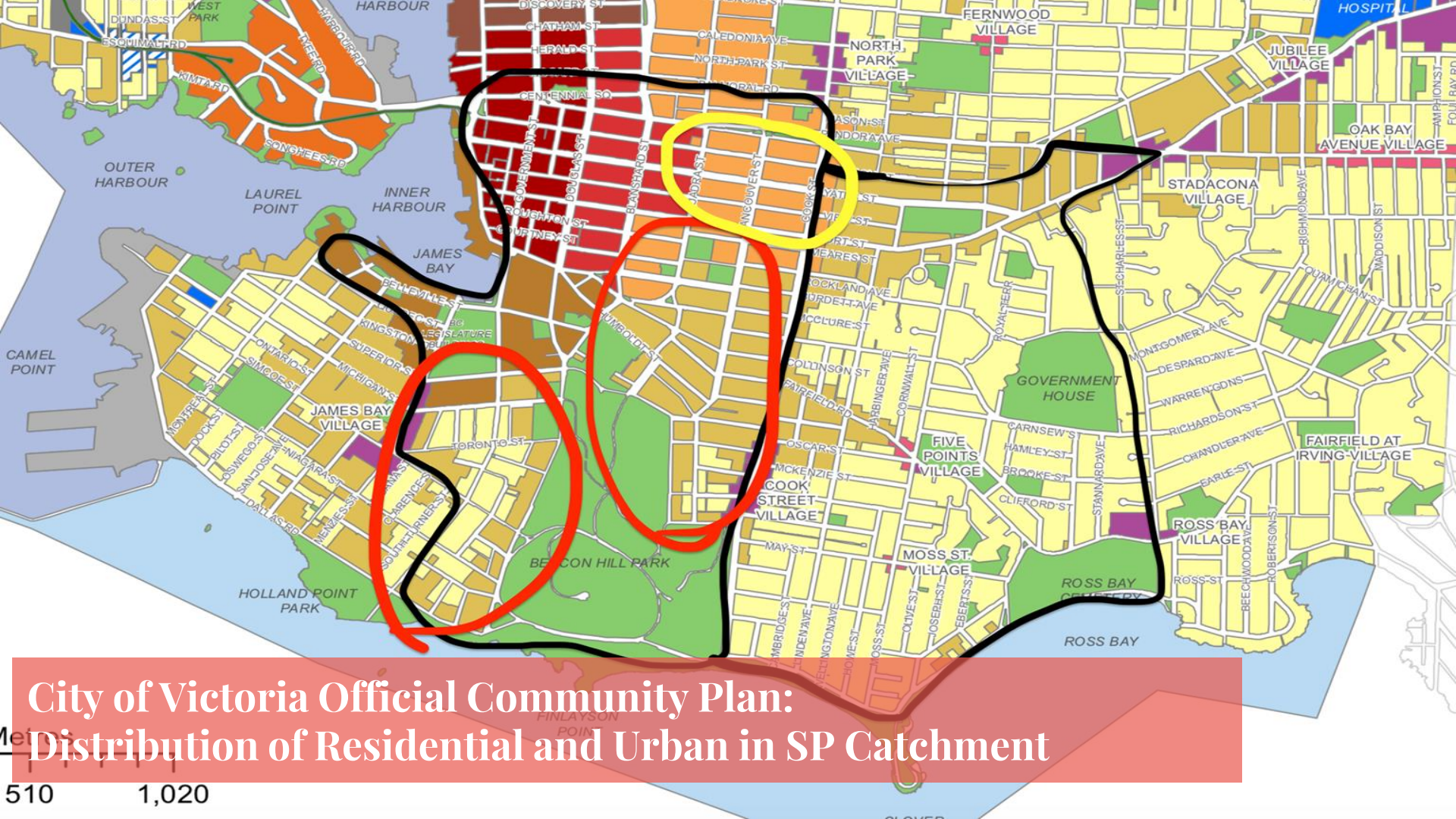

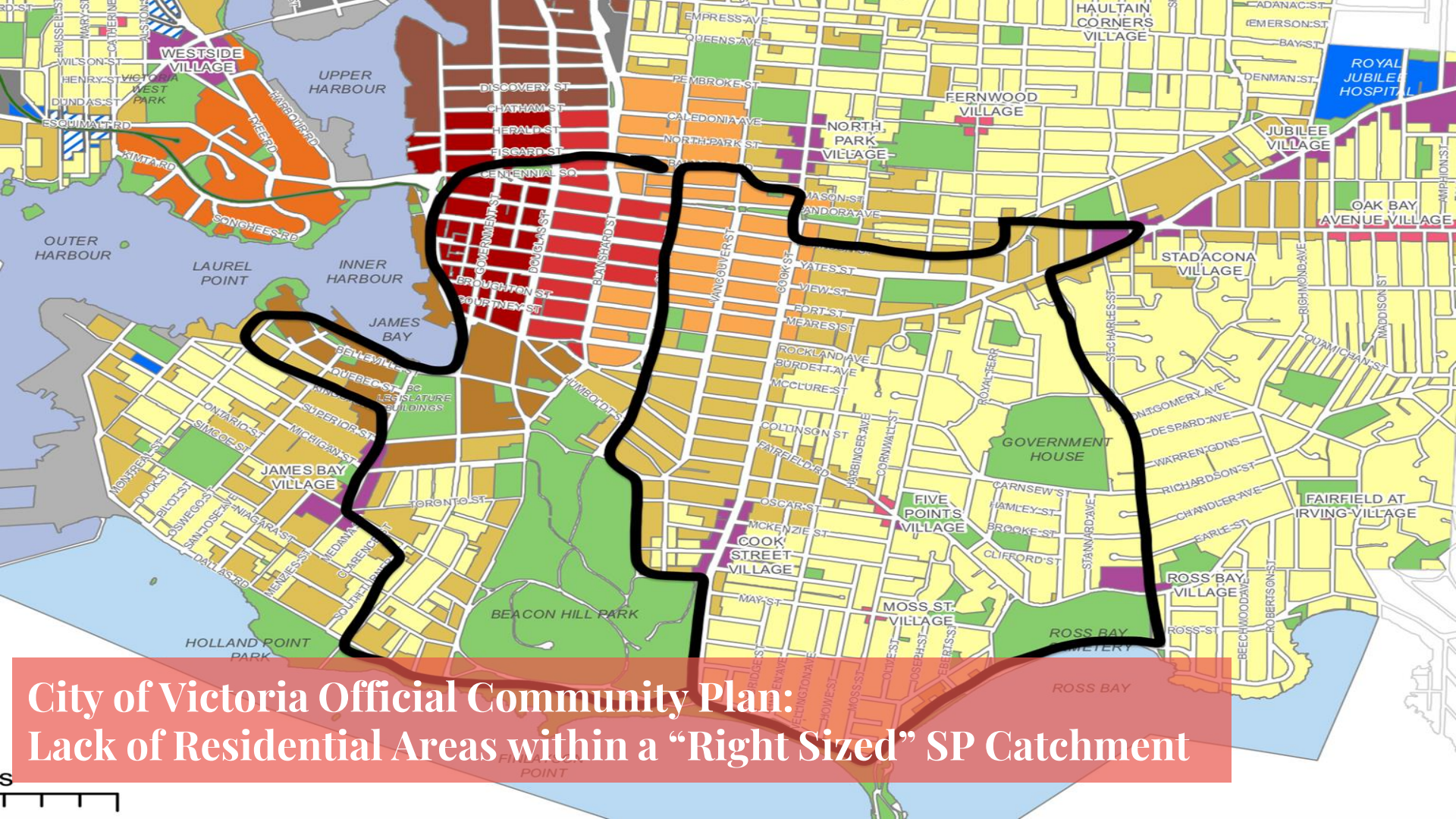

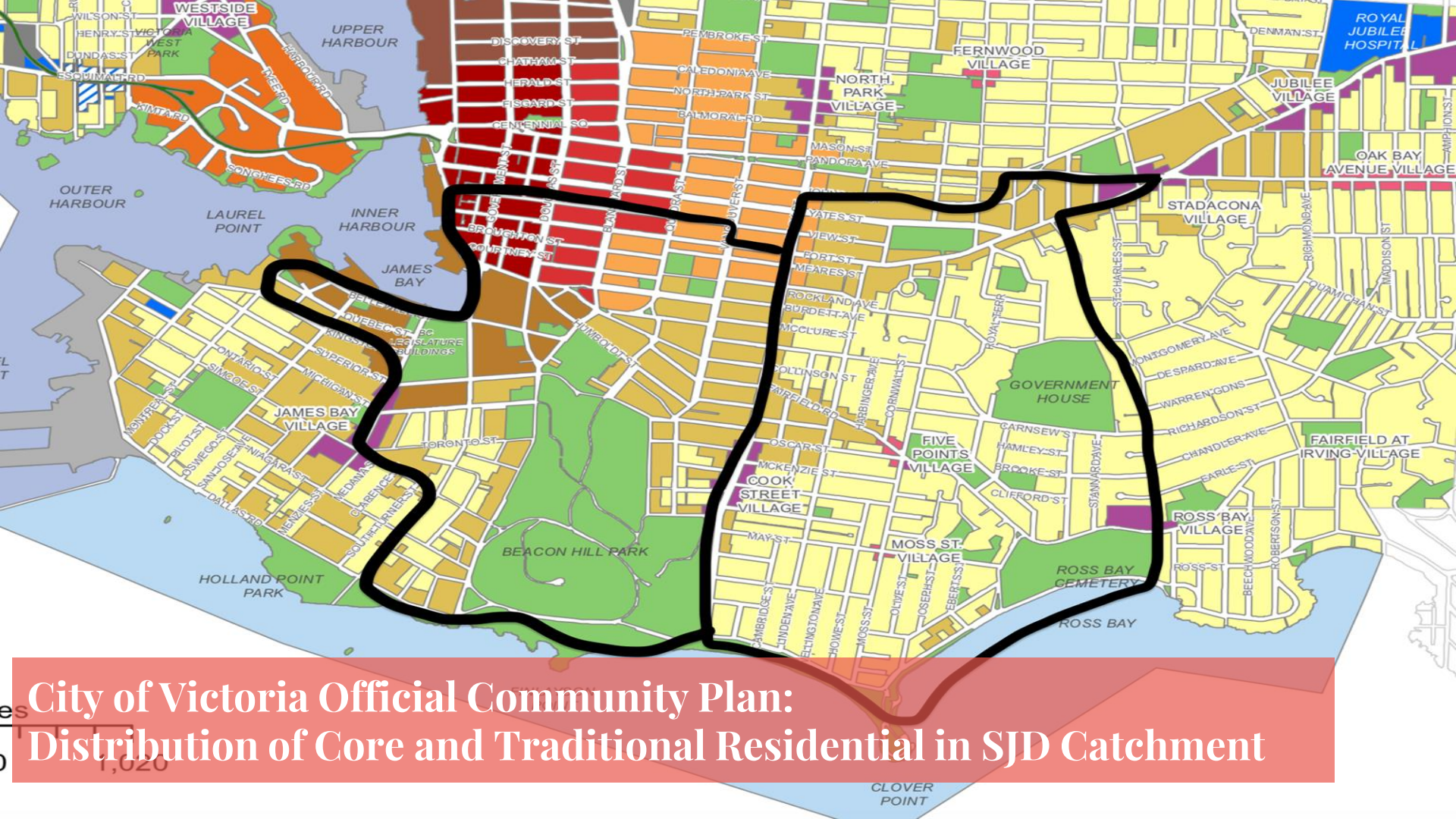
City of Victoria Official Community Plan: CBD & Inner Harbour/Legislative



City of Victoria Official Community Plan: Distribution of Residential and Urban in SP Catchment

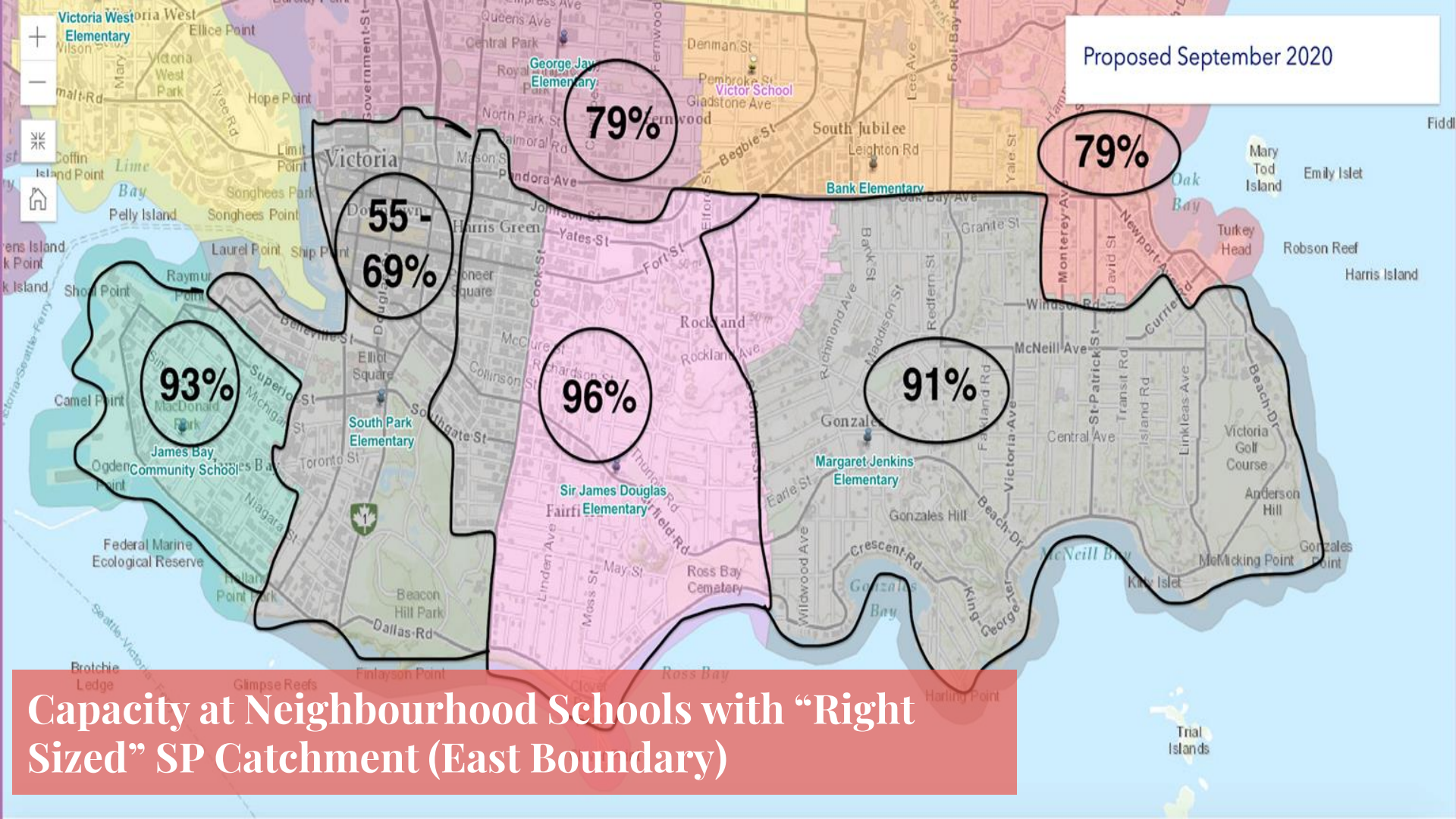


**City of Victoria Official Community Plan:
Lack of Residential Areas within a “Right Sized” SP Catchment**



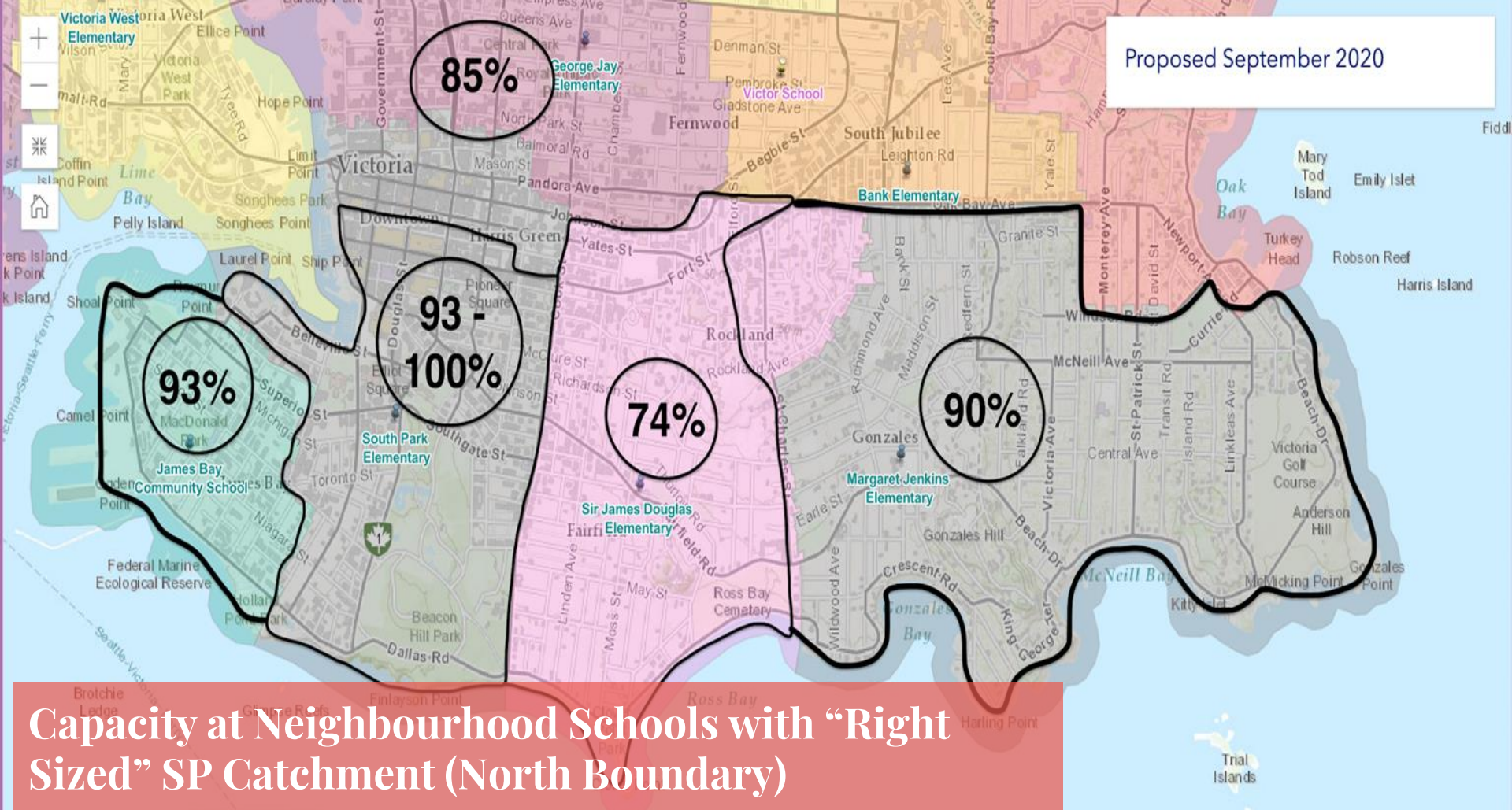
City of Victoria Official Community Plan: Distribution of Core and Traditional Residential in SJD Catchment

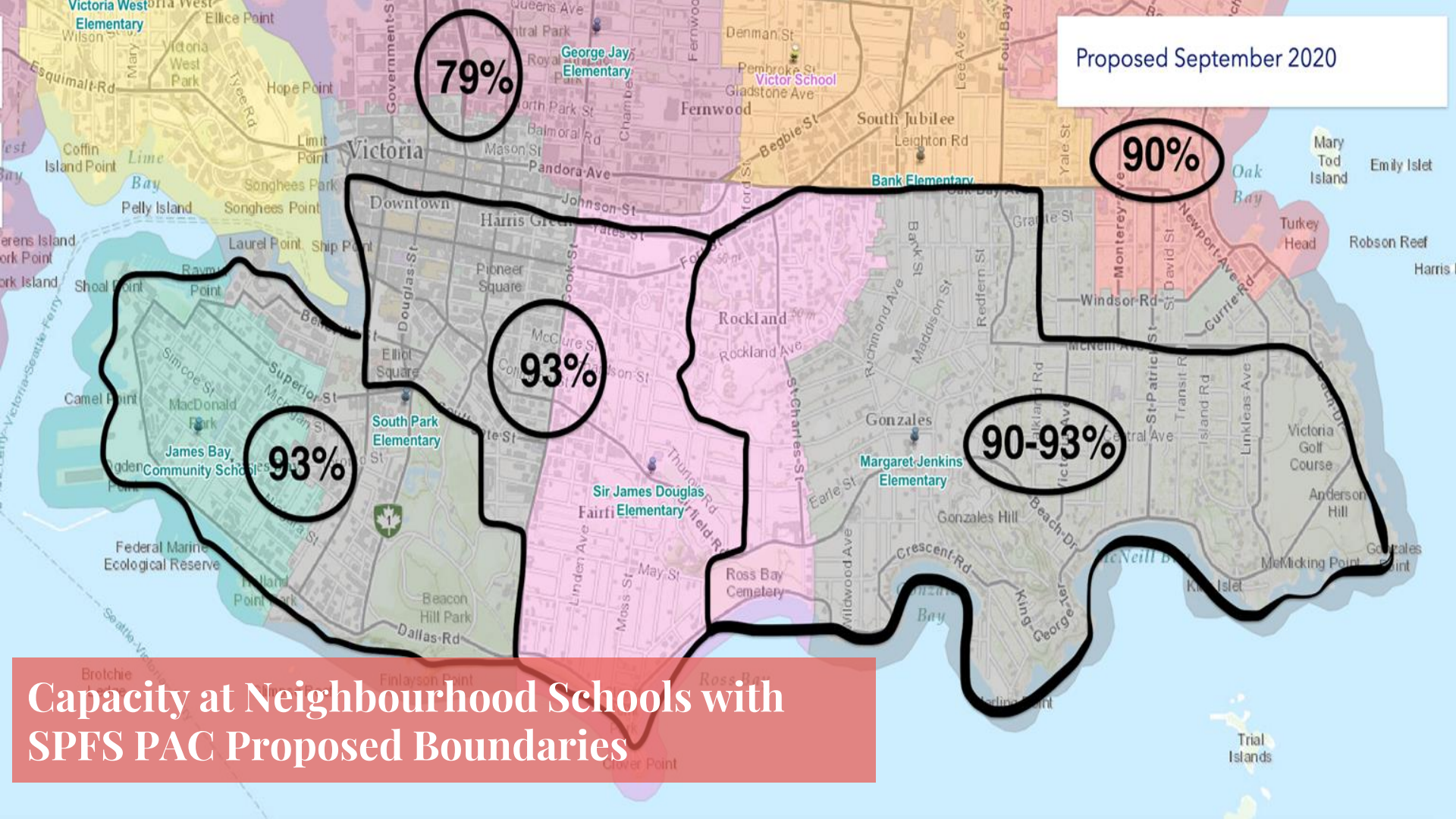


Capacity at Neighbourhood Schools with "Right Sized" SP Catchment (East Boundary)

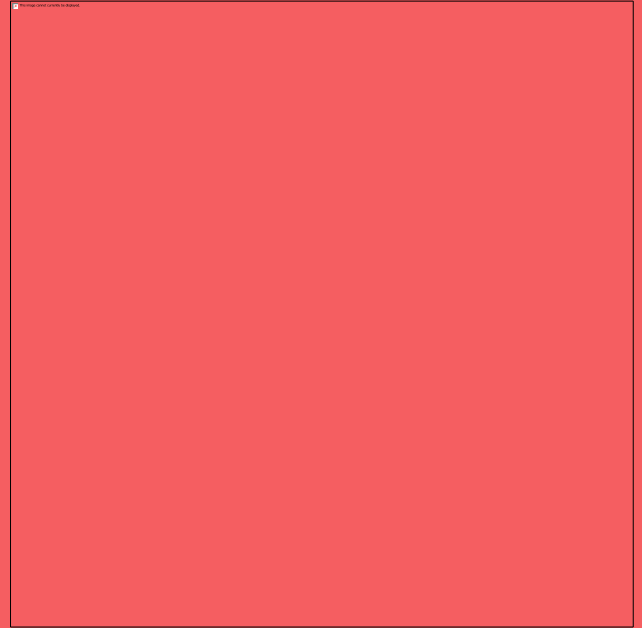

Capacity at Neighbourhood Schools with “Right Sized” SP Catchment (North Boundary)

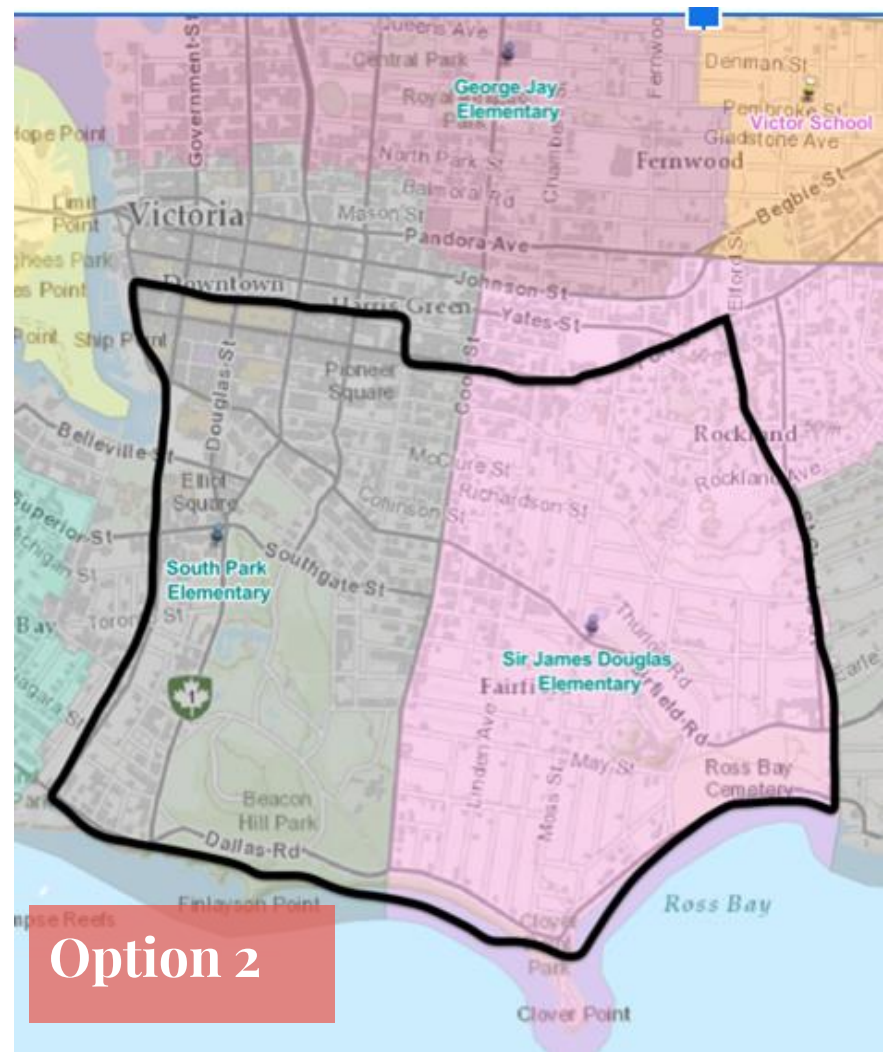
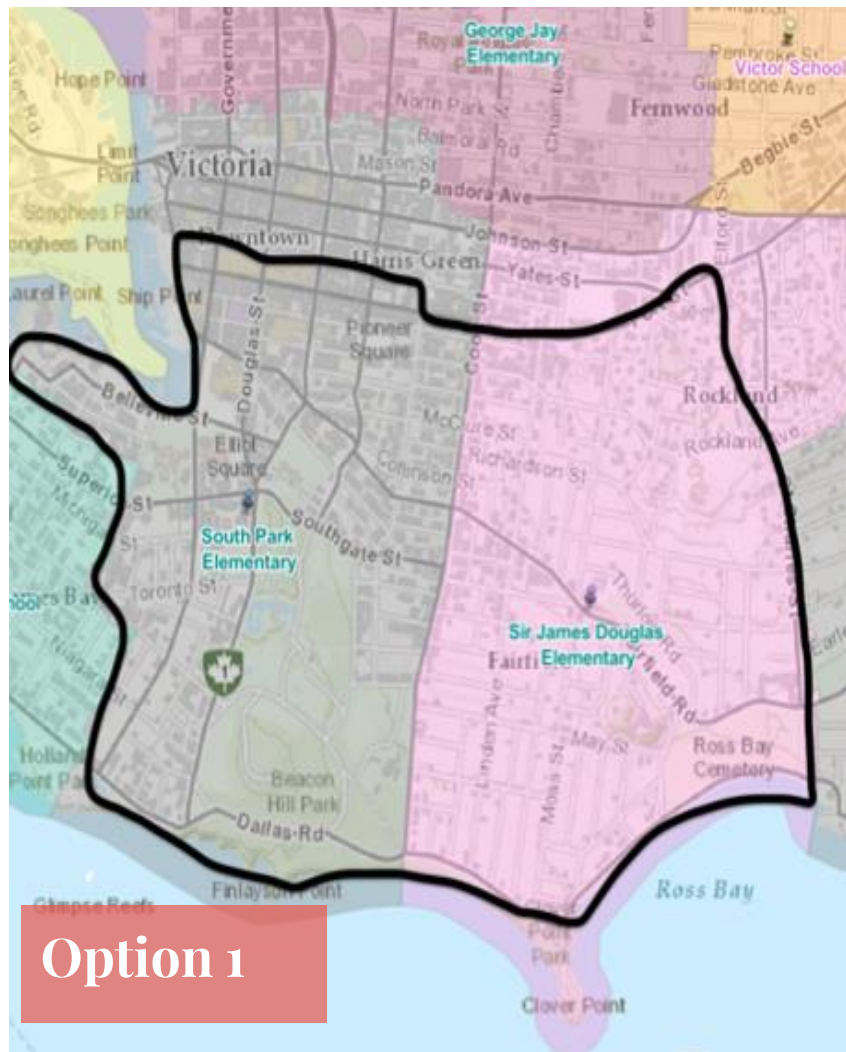

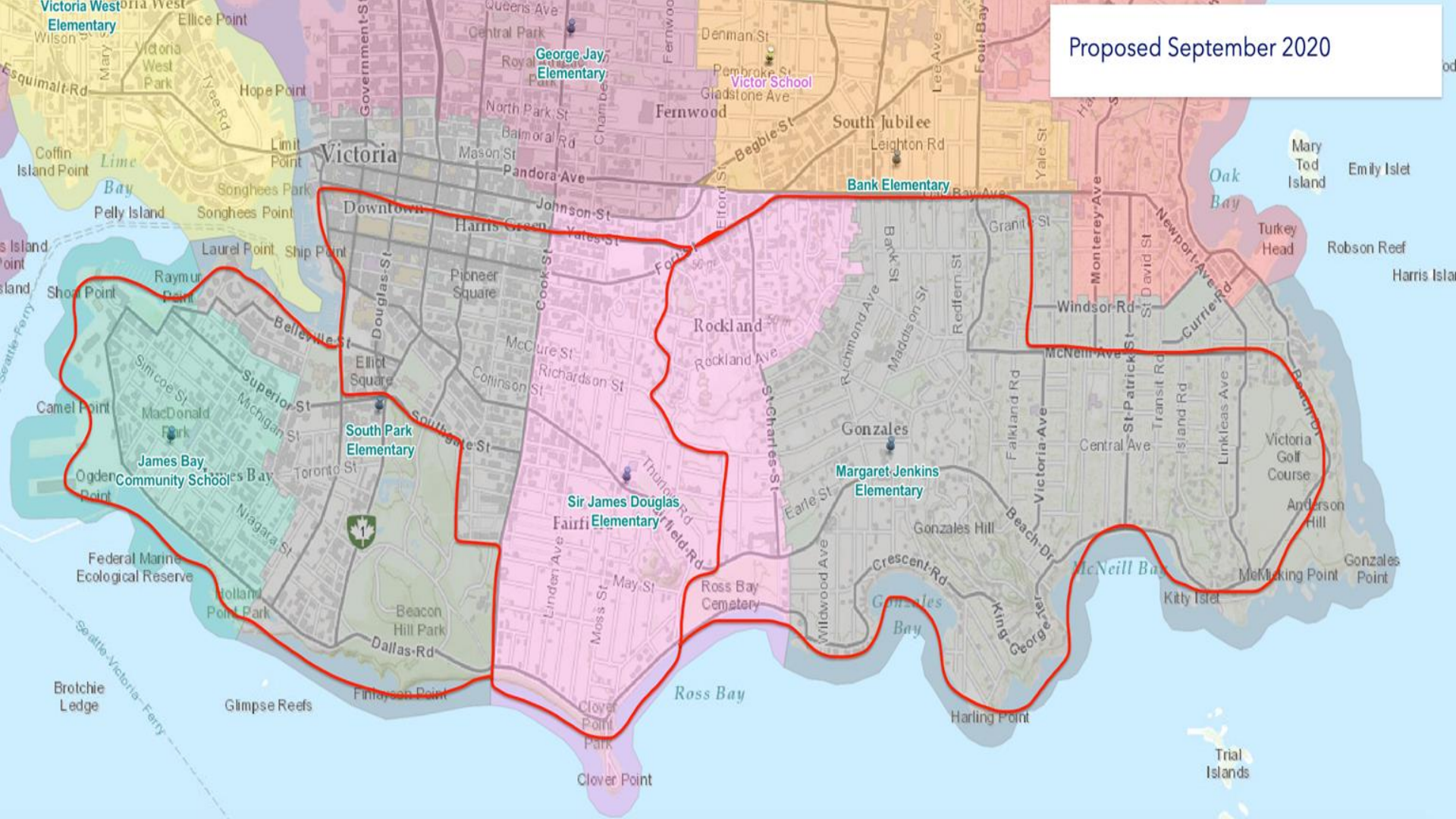


Addressing District Concerns

- Limited the ability for SJD to assume Rockland area

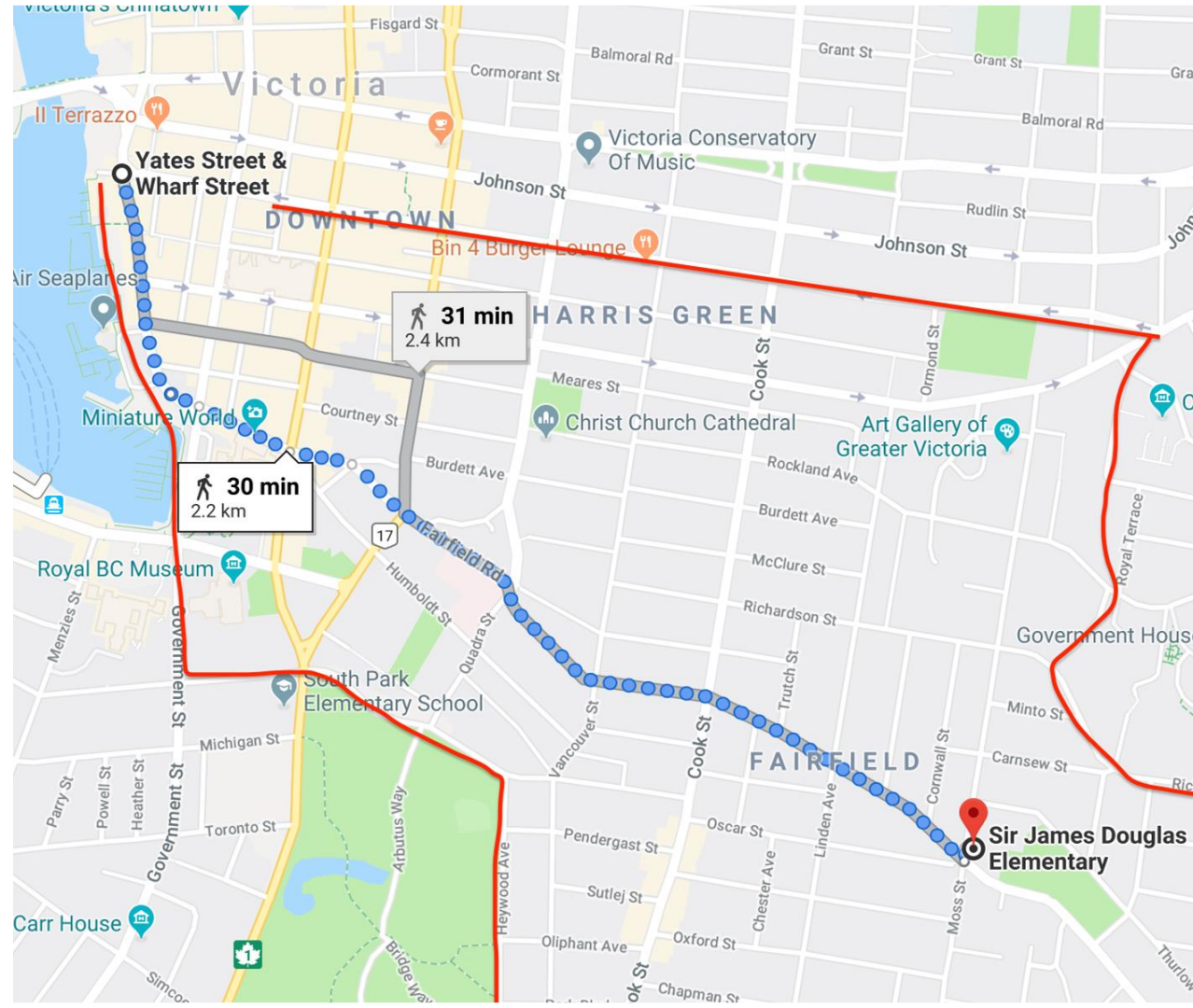

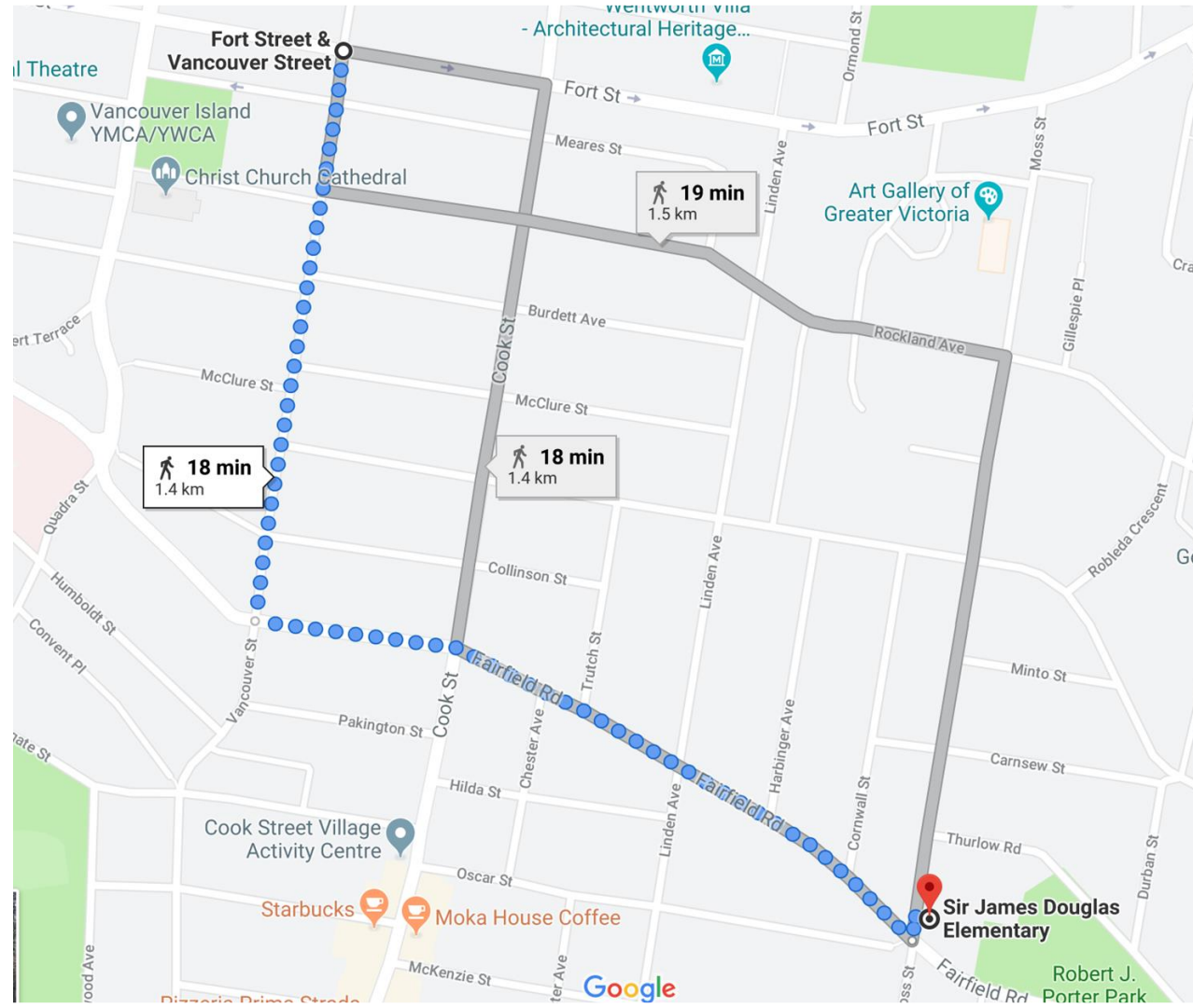
Walking Distances

- Comparable to District and current catchment
- Longest from downtown core
- Bus routes available



Walking Distances

- Improved for many families who now go to SJD



Addressing District Concerns

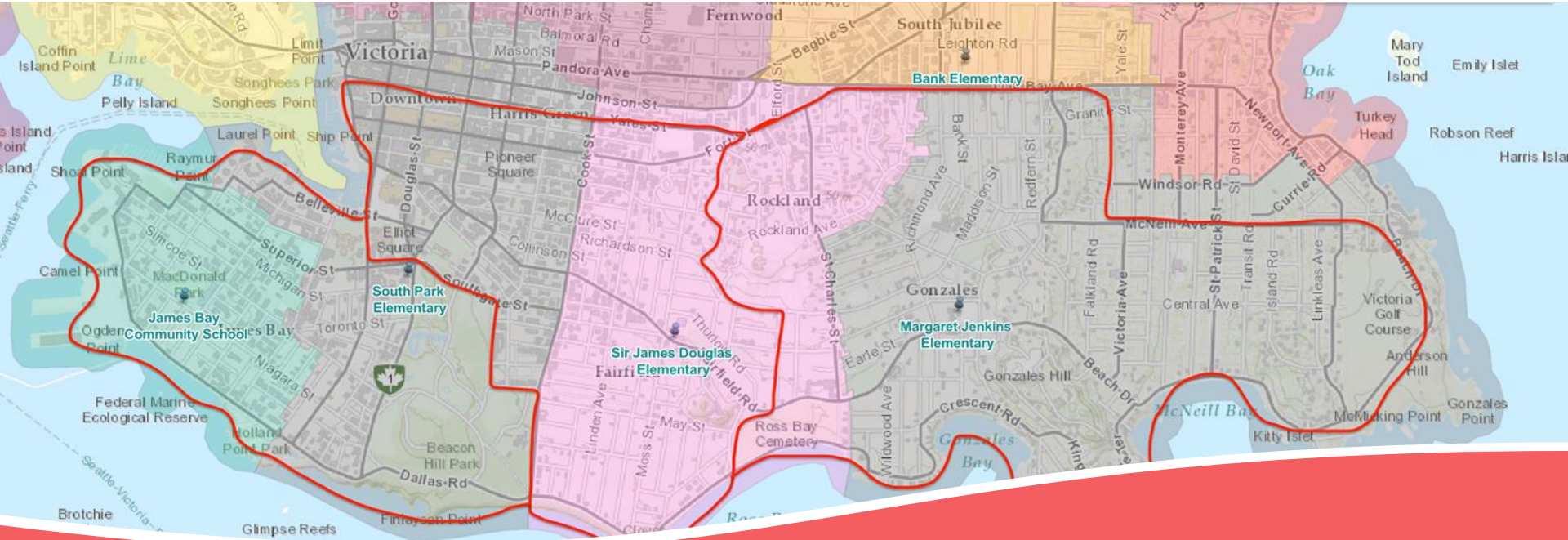
- It created long walking distances

- Hard to “right size” SP catchment
- Ends SPFS parent participation program
- Does not shift students more equitably into under enrolled schools



Benefits of the SPFS Proposal

- Balances enrolment
- Shifts students equitably
- 81-101 additional spaces
- Educational aspirations of the community maintained
