Planning for the Future: Craigflower/Shoreline





Introduction

- Craigflower Elementary School has a high risk seismic ranking (H1)
- Shoreline Middle School has a high risk seismic ranking (H1)
- **SD61 is consulting on potential seismic options** , which include:
 - Seismic Upgrade for both Shoreline and Craigflower
 - Seismic Upgrade and Expansion for Shoreline/Reconfigure to K-8 (close Craigflower and move students to Shoreline)
 - Seismic Upgrade for Shoreline / No improvements to Craigflower
 - Seismic Upgrade for Craigflower / No improvements to Shoreline
- In November 2020, Board approved consultation for seismic options and the consideration of the closure of Craigflower.
- Public Engagement includes survey (open from Jan. 15-29th)
- Online Virtual Open House Thursday, Jan. 21st at 6:30 p.m.

Option 2: Craigflower/Shoreline **Amalgamation**

- Upgrade and expand Shoreline
- Close Craigflower as an elementary school
- Shoreline becomes K-8 configuration; with 700 seats
- Amalgamation or not, Shoreline and Craigflower need seismic work



Shoreline Upgrade/Expansion

What could this look like?

- Shoreline renovated on current site
- Students remain in existing schools during upgrade
- Shoreline becomes K-8 configuration; 700 seats
- French Immersion expanded from 6-8 to K-8
- School could be divided into two schools on one campus
- Grade configuration could be changed (e.g., K-3 & 4-8)
- Centralized services for students and families (e.g., childcare, health hub)

Learning/Educational Programming

- Indigenous Ways of Knowing
- Indigenous Languages
- French Immersion

Partnerships with the Songhees and Esquimalt Nations

Guiding Principles include:

- Enhancing student learning and providing equitable learning opportunities for all students
- Creating a culturally responsive learning environment
- Ensuring the schools have a meaningful connection and structured link to the communities they serve



Deferred Maintenance

- Used to determine the cost of all future repairs and system replacement and when
- Used for future capital planning
- Used for budgeting annual maintenance
- All SD61buildings are audited on a 3-5 year cycle
- Ministry of Education contractor performs audits



Seismic Program

BC Seismic Mitigation Program

- All SD61schools assessed in 2018
- 15 schools in SD61are H1, including Craigflower and Shoreline

H1High Risk

- Most vulnerable structure
- Highest risk of widespread damage or structural failure
- Not repairable after event
- Structural and non-structural seismic upgrades required

High 1 (H1)	High 2 (H2)	High 3 (H3)	Medium (M)	Low (L)
Risk to life safety > 10%	Risk to life safety ≤ 10% and > 7%	Risk to life safety ≤ 7% and > 5%	Risk to life safety ≤5% and > 2%	Risk to life safety ≤ 2%



Safety

H1 ranking makes both Craigflower and Shoreline a priority for SD61 and the Province

Both are major capital projects

Goal is to upgrade both schools for safety

- 2 Options Deliver:
 - Option 1: Seismic upgrade both schools
 - Option 2: Seismic upgrade Shoreline/Close Craigflower/Reconfigure/Expand

Financial

Both capital (long term infrastructure) and operating (day to day running) must be considered when evaluating options.

Option # 1 - Seismic Upgrade Both Schools
2 - Seismic Upgrade and Expansion at Shoreline/Reconfigure K-8/Close Craigflower
3 - Seismic Upgrade at Shoreline Only
4 - Seismic Upgrade at Craigflower Only

Capital Cost (\$Millions)	Operating Cost (\$Millions)	Cost
\$54m	5.189	8,000
\$47m	5.014	185,000
\$30m	5.192	6,000
\$24m	5.196	2,000

If our goal is to provide seismic upgrading for both schools to ensure safety, from a financial perspective, Options 1 and 2 should be considered.

Option 2 would score higher because it has lower capital costs and more savings than Option 1

Options 3 and 4 do not provide seismic upgrade for both schools

Environment & Sustainability

General rule of thumb: the older the building the less energy efficient/sustainable

New construction or major renovation greatly improves energy efficiency



Proximity of Schools


Craigflower and Shoreline are 650 metres apart.

Craigflower Projections:


- 117 students currently enrolled in Craigflower (K-5)
- School capacity is 219 students
- 59% capacity utilization

Shoreline Projections:


- 300 students currently enrolled in Shoreline (6-8)
- School capacity is 425 students
- 72% capacity utilization
