OVERVIEW

The Greater Victoria School District provides public educational services to over 20,000 students in the Greater Victoria area. Among the strategic goals of the District is the ongoing work to create culturally responsive practices and learning environments that will support Indigenous learners' well-being and success. As a member of the Indigenous Education Department team, The Métis Education Student & Family Advocate will provide leadership that will support an increased knowledge and appreciated of Métis history and culture, promote a strong sense of identity among Métis students and families, and support the well-being and success of Métis learners.

POSITION DESCRIPTION MÉTIS EDUCATIONAL STUDENT & FAMILY ADVOCATE

MESFA - 1

Highlight, develop and implement culturally responsive resources to support Métis students in our schools

MESFA - 2

Collaborate with schools on initiatives that seek to build relationships with Métis families and community and to build knowledge and appreciates of Métis culture, history and current realities

MESFA - 3

Collaborate with the Indigenous Education Department to provide schools access to resources in order to promote understanding of Métis history students and families and develop initiatives that strengthen the relations between Métis, families, community and schools.

MESFA - 4

In collaboration with schools, monitor Métis student holistic well-being and support student access to services available in the school and community

MESFA - 5

In collaboration with District and school staff, advocate for Métis students and families and develop initiatives that strengthen the relationship between Métis students, families, community and schools.

MESFA - 6

In collaboration with schools, community and families, support initiatives to help Métis students transition between primary, middle, high and postsecondary education

MESFA - 7

When needed, participate in School Based Team meetings to develop plans for Métis students who may require additional cultural or holistic support in schools

MESFA - 8

Support initiatives and opportunities for Métis students to connect with mentors and role models

MESFA - 9

Promote and support Métis cultural events in the Greater Victoria School District

MESFA - 10

Conduct home and community visits as needed

MESFA - 11

Collaborate with the Métis community and Elders regarding Métis culture and accessing resources

QUALIFICATIONS FORM MÉTIS EDUCATIONAL STUDENT & FAMILY ADVOCATE

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS
Grade 12 or equivalent; and,
A minimum of two (2) years post-secondary education in Indigenous/First Nations Studies, Social Work or Child & Youth Care. Including a minimum of twelve (12) credits in Indigenous/First Nations Studies is required.
Valid Class 5 British Columbia Driver's License
TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS
Two (2) years demonstrated experience working with Indigenous children and families, preferably in an educational or childcare context
Preference will be given to applicants with registered Métis ancestry
TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS
Demonstrated knowledge of historical Métis culture, worldviews and contemporary discourses experiences by Métis people and community
Demonstrated knowledge of Lekwungen territory in which GVSD is located
Demonstrated experience and knowledge creating and leading programs and initiatives, preferably with Métis focus
Knowledge of the local, provincial and national resources for Métis students and families
JOB SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS
Ability to provide support to Métis students in achieving personal, academic, social and behavioural goals
Provides support to students in acquiring independence and life skills
Ability to adapt and respond to the varying academic, social, emotional and behavioural needs of students
Ability to facilitate the understanding of Métis culture, heritage, customs and values
Strong relational, organizational and communication skills

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
