Refusal of Unsafe Work in K-12 Public Education **Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)**

On August 22, 2022, the Occupational Health and Safety Regulation was amended to introduce a written notice requirement before permitting another worker to do work that has been the subject of a work refusal (Section 3.12.1). WorkSafeBC subsequently updated Guideline G3.12 Refusal of unsafe work to reflect this amendment. The Regulation and Guideline set out overarching direction and guidance regarding the refusal of unsafe work processes that are applicable to all employment sectors. There are, however, complex and nuanced circumstances unique to the K-12 public education sector, particularly work refusals arising out of interactions with dysregulated students that are not specifically addressed in these documents.

BCPSEA has partnered with the BC Principals' and Vice-Principals' Association, BC Teachers Federation, Canadian Union of Public Employees, School Safety Association of BC, WorkSafeBC, and school districts to prepare a supplementary sector-specific FAQ guide to support efficient refusal of unsafe work processes within our sector.
