

Indigenous Education Assistant

Position Description | Qualifications

OVERVIEW

The role of the Indigenous Education Assistant (IEA) is under the overall direction of the Indigenous Education Department (IED). The IEA is dually supervised between the Director of Indigenous Education and the school-based Administrator. The IEA provides social, emotional cultural and academic support and guidance to Indigenous students and families. Further, this position serves as a role model and cultural liaison for Indigenous students and families to help bridge Indigenous worldviews and perspectives across the school community.

POSITION DESCRIPTION INDIGENOUS EDUCATION ASSISTANT

IEA - 1

Provides enhanced social, emotional, cultural and academic supports to Indigenous students in collaboration with the IED and the school-based administration.

IEA - 2

Support Indigenous learning strategies that support Indigenous students in developing holistic concepts and skills.

IEA - 3

Advocates for the use of culturally responsive resources, supplies and equipment for Indigenous students within the classroom and across the school community.

IEA - 4

Provides mentoring through culturally responsive programs for Indigenous students and families to help strengthen their cultural identities.

IEA - 5

Advocates for the use of Indigenous worldview and perspectives within the school community to support Indigenous students and families.

IEA - 6

Liaise with Indigenous students and families on the culturally responsive supports available for them at a school-based and district-based level.

IEA - 7

Maintains Indigenous student records as per the 1701 Audit Guidelines.

IEA - 8

Encourages Indigenous students and families to participate in school activities, field trips, social and cultural opportunities, and work experience.

IEA - 9

Advocates, when appropriate, the use of digital technology for Indigenous students.

IEA - 10

Advocates for the use of restorative practice as a method to supporting Indigenous students and families in classrooms and the school community.

IEA - 11

Supports Indigenous student related information with school staff, classroom teachers, school-based Administrators, and the Indigenous Education Department.

IEA - 12

Participates in monthly Indigenous Education Department staff meetings and any other meetings at the discretion of the Director of Indigenous Education.

IEA - 13

Provides assistance to students in the case of injury or illness.

IEA - 14

Performs any other assigned duties during fire/earthquake drills and any other crisis situations.

IEA - 15

Performs other assigned comparable or transient duties which are within the area of knowledge and skills required by this job description that support Indigenous student and families and/or the Indigenous community as directed by the Director of Indigenous Education.

	Prioritize workload and manage time appropriately.
	Document and summarize information/data in an accurate manner.

Provide guidance, instructions and directions to students.
